





A group of about fifty adult Swiss Sabbath-keepers in a network of inter-related families, largely watchmakers by occupation, clustered in five or six mountain villages north of Neuchatel, had invited the church to send a missionary to them to be their minister and to use their community as a base for taking the church's message of the Sabbath and the imminent Second Advent to Europe.



In 1873, the General Conference Session voted to send a missionary to Europe. And in 1874, it was decided that this missionary would be John N. Andrews—"the ablest man in our ranks," as Ellen White called him.



On September 15, 1874, John Andrews sailed from New York City for England, en route to Switzerland. He was accompanied by his two motherless children, Charles and Mary, and by Adémar Vuilleumier, a Swiss believer who had been studying English at Battle Creek.









John Nevins Andrews has been called the "intellectual giant" of early Adventism, and the "foremost Adventist intellectual of the 19th Century." He was a pioneer scholarevangelist who helped shape the church profoundly in manifold ways. He helped shape its early theology and prophetic understanding through his preaching and writing as a Melanchthon to the early James White.

His early apologetic writing on doctrinal and prophetic understanding helped establish Adventist self-identity over against first-day Adventists, a significant contribution Uriah Smith referenced in the obituary he wrote for his brother-in-law. He credited Andrews with being "especially instrumental in bringing out light upon the subjects of the Sanctuary, the United States in Prophecy and the Messages of Revelation 14."












- •Sending two families to Northern Nigeria Union to evangelize for one year and two families to the Central African Republic to evangelize remote areas.
- Training and deploying 10 volunteers to serve within the union this year.



CAMEROON UNION MISSION

- Sending a missionary couple to Mali for 2 years. The husband is a biology teacher and the wife is a nurse. They are serving there since the end of July 2024.
- Training and deploying 40 volunteers to serve within and outside the union this year.





EASTERN NIGERIA UNION CONFERENCE

- 1. 4 Fields: Port Harcourt East, Port Harcourt West, Aba East, and Rivers North are Sponsoring 2 Ordained Ministers to serve in weaker fields within ENUC.
- 2. The Union is sending 2 frontline Pastors to three fields within ENUC that are missions to prepare them for Conference Status.
- 3. The Union is sending 1 missionary outside ENUC territory by next year.
- 4. 31 Volunteers are ready to be deployed for mission
- 5. Training and deploying additional 40 volunteers to serve within the union this year.



- 1. The Union is in the process of sending two lay missionaries to the Volta region (SGUC)
- 2. The Union has already sent 2 missionaries in northern Benin among the Fulani in the Wassapioncom region since mid-2022. They were visited by Pastor Kra and Pastor Koulete in 2022.
- 3. Training and deploying 16 volunteers to serve within and outside the union this year.



NORTHERN GHANA UNION CONFERENCE

- 1. Adoption of Burkina Faso, by sponsering a frontline Minister.
- 2. Inwardly, the Union will continue to give financial support to the Upper East, Upper West, and North Ghana Mission with funds and also continue to send more people for Public Evangelism quarterly.
- 3. Training and deploying 10 volunteers to serve within the union this year.



NORTHERN NIGERIA UNION CONFERENCE

- To send an ordained minister as church planter among the Hausa speaking communities of Northern Ghana Union for a year
- Training and deploying 30 volunteers to serve within and outside the union this year.





SOUTHERN GHANA UNION CONFERENCE

- Sending Two Pastors to Upper East Mission and Two Pastor Teachers to Gambia.
- Training and deploying 55 volunteers to serve within and outside the union this year.



WEST AFRICAN UNION MISSION

- Sending a minimum of 6 Bible Teachers and Evangelists to Guinea Conakry, 2024.
- Training and deploying 10 volunteers to serve within and outside the union this year.





WESTERN NIGERIA UNION CONFERENCE

Work to enter and reach 2 People groups:

- Nupe People Group of both Kwara and Kogi States within the WNUC Field.
- Also, the Akoko People Group of both Ondo and Edo States within WNUC territory.
- They purpose to concentrate on shoring up Kogi Region to become a Mission field. Also, they intend to keep working with Ondo Mission to become a Conference field within the shortest time possible.
- Presently, the Lagos Atlantic Conference is giving monthly appropriation to support one (1) minister in Ondo Mission and one (1) minister in Kwara Conference.
- This year, two (2) of their institutions; Ife SDA Hospital and SDA College of Nursing also in Ife, have also adopted giving monthly appropriations towards payments of two (2) pastors in Kogi.
- Training and deploying 22 volunteers to serve within and outside the union this year.






WESTERN SAHEL UNION MISSION


